Reading Mark 10:35-45

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to him and said to him, 'Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you.' And he said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' And they said to him, 'Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory.' But Jesus said to them, 'You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?' They replied, 'We are able.' Then Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared.'

When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John. So Jesus called them and said to them, 'You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.'

Reflection

One of the things that I appreciate most in the Bible, and particularly in the Gospels is that they seek to portray humanity warts and all! I think I would struggle to if the Bible only ever told stories of perfect people living perfect lives, making only right and honourable decisions. Don't get me wrong, I think that we should strive to be the best people we can be, becoming better people by and under the influence of the Holy Spirit, but I have long come to acknowledge that the imperfect will only be made perfect when I reach heaven, and that in the meantime, or as Paul writes "when perfection comes, the imperfect will disappear" (1 Cor 13; 10).

We all love a story with a hero, and the Bible gives us so many, Moses, David, Abraham, Peter, Paul, and numerous others, but the one thing they all have in common is they all have flaws and imperfection in their lives. Dodgy histories, wrong decisions, poor judgements, mixed motives, (please feel free to add your own

biblical heroes and list of their imperfections) and yet still God chooses to use them, and their story of faith has become the inspiration of others through the centuries.

In today's reading we find James and John, at first glance seeming to ask the wrong question, 'we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you.' How selfish is this question, or at least how immature, it almost sounds as if they saw in Jesus to be the source of all their unfulfilled wants and desires. As we read further, we discover that the real desire of their hearts is to have the place of honour - to be seated at the right and left hand of Jesus. To be seated at left hand and right hand denotes wanting the place of highest honour next to Jesus, to be known as being amongst the inner, inner circle, and with it to be given authority. Little wonder when the other disciples heard this, "they became angry with James and John". As postscript to this story, anger is not a wholesome emotion either in this context.

We see too often in life the image and stories of those who seek honour, and a pre-assumed authority, often camouflaged as power. Our world is impacted, and in turn our lives greatly by those who assume that their name, their position or status in society gives them the authority to rule over, disempower, or impugn the lives of others, and sadly the life of Church is not immune from these sorts of people. Over the years I have met countless people who no longer are part of a faith community because individuals in that community have asked of themselves the wrong question. They have asked how to dominate, rather than how to serve.

Jesus reminds the disciples, all twelve of them, not just James and John, that 'the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve'. How often do we need to remind ourselves that the greatest gift in life is to serve others. One of the hallmarks of the church seen in Acts was that they were together in that they shared all they had, the rich sharing with the poor. The hallmark of our Circuit system is that those churches with an abundance of finance, resources, talents should share in the mission and ministry of those churches who are not so blessed.

When I was a young child, we were taught the acronym of JOY - Jesus first, yourself last, and others in between - Oh to be adults with childlike faith once more.
